As a tradition, Pack 80 attends a weeklong resident camp at Camp Acahela. Camp Acahela lies at the confluence of the Lehigh River and the Tobyhanna Creek on 224 acres of Pocono woodlands near Blakeslee, Pennsylvania at the borders of Carbon, Monroe and Luzerne Counties. In the Native American language of the Lenape, “Acahela” translates as “The Joining of the Waters.” The camp offers the boys opportunities to participate in seven program areas. Campers are housed in two-man canvas tents on wooden platforms, with a cot furnished for each camper. All meals are prepared by the food service staff and are served in the camp dining hall. Latrines are provided, and hot shower facilities are available. This camping adventure is open to all cub scouts of Pack 80.

Aquatics: The boys will have the opportunity to cool off in the pool, tube the Lehigh and practice swimming techniques with the certified staff.

BB Gun Range: The boys will learn proper safety techniques and precautions when using a BB gun. After the boys know the techniques, they will have the opportunity to shoot on the BB Gun Range.

Archery Range: The scouts will learn proper safety techniques and precautions when using the bow. After the boys know the techniques, they will have the opportunity to shoot on the Archery Range.

Scout Skills: Cubs will learn basic skills pertaining to the outdoors. Things, such as basic knot tying, fire building and safety as well as basic first aid and flag etiquette. Webelos will continue fine tuning their skills as well as learning about compass and fire building and safety. All skills covered will help prepare these Scouts for the adventures of Boy Scouting.

Crafts: The boys will have the opportunity to work on rank appropriate crafts.

Games: The boys will have the opportunity to participate in organized games.

Nature: The boys will have the opportunity to go on hikes around the camp, go fishing in the Lehigh River as well as learn about the outdoors. The Cubs will learn to increase their ability to pay attention to their surroundings while the Webelos will sharpen their outdoor skills to prepare them for a day hike and out-post camping trip.

Obstacle Course: Camp Acahela has created an obstacle course that is appropriate for all age groups. It will challenge each scouts balance and coordination in a safe environment.
